By Faith we Are Healed

(Yoneq gave the Bible to some of the youth and had them read wherever they opened to.)

Seth read Rev 2:12.

John was writing to the people at Pergamum. Balaam was a prophet, not of Israel. Balak, the king of Molek wanted Balaam to pronounce a curse on Israel — he tried to get the women of Molek to seduce the men of Israel. He would have liked to have Israel cursed, but he knew he couldn't because they weren't cursed, so he got to them through their sensual appetites (women went into their tents) — this was an evil scheme (Numbers 22-25).

Shimoney Yom read Heb 8:8-12.

All will know Him — but back then most were going on in ritual — their obedience was not produced by the heart. Our Father will make a covenant with a whole *nation* and Israel will be under this in the next age. But now He has particular groups of people in the Edah — bridging the gap between Old and New Israel — a *special* people producing the fruit of true Israel. We are a nation without much understanding, but we are going to make the Jews jealous. We are gaining back the land for Israel — what they can't gain for themselves.

In order to put Satan under His feet it will take *every one* of us — from the least to the greatest — not just the prophets, evangelists, but all. If you just have one talent and you are faithful with your gifting, then you will be great in the kingdom. Our Father won't reward those who have much, but aren't faithful. There is total equality in the kingdom. Our Father will make the Jews jealous by a people without understanding. We need to cry out for *understanding* — and we *will* have understanding.

Mt 9:29 — Yahshua touched their eyes and they saw. They had faith (they heard and obeyed) and Yahshua said, "*It is done according to your faith.*" What had to be going on in their hearts before they were healed? No one can just trust — something had to happen. They had to hear and something had to well up in their hearts and they had to hear the Spirit telling them to follow Him and ask for healing. God had to speak to them first (they had to hear faith) and then they could be healed. They had to make a confession in their heart and with their mouth — this is the way people are healed. They were insistent — they groped their way into the house (He hides Himself from us to see if we'll find Him — if not we'll panic — although He is never farther away from us than our heart and our mouth). Without faith — it is only vain pursuit (*rasha*). The blind men were rewarded for their faith.

Faith comes by hearing the Word of God — He speaks to us and then we can be saved and do anything. There was that drawing by something supernatural — remember when we heard (every time we heard)? We can't do anything until faith comes to us — it is far off, and then it comes a little at a time. Faith is a substance, something we need to believe and be healed.
