

Lemon Party: Inadvertence, Women in Leadership, and other Topics

Sometimes we should have a lemon party. A lemon party is when we get together and talk about things in each other's lives that are not sweet. We talk about it in an honest, straightforward, and positive way. How are we going to learn about these things in our life and change if no one ever tells us about it. We have to devote some night to a lemon party and help people in a really nice and gentle way. Especially as leaders, we should have such a relationship with each other that we can tell each other these things that we see in each others' lives that don't express the character of our Master.

The person who sees something in another person and doesn't go to him is hating him. He is afraid, a coward, going to the lake of fire if he is really a coward. What would love demand if you could say something to a person that would cause him to progress, see his problem, his sin (Gal 6:1)? Would Yahshua or the Holy Spirit hinder us and intimidate us? What if someone does something inadvertently. Like some people inadvertently pray two or three times in the minchah. They shouldn't do it. They only should pray once and let others pray, too. They pray everything so others cannot.

Inadvertence

Inadvertent — from a lack of attention, inconsiderate, not turning your attention to (in our case to the Spirit), negligent from lack of want or attention. Many mistakes and many misfortunes proceed from inadvertence. Like burning down four teepees with a candle, because you never got a candle holder. You always put the candles on wood and no one ever said anything. *Inadvertence* is the oversight that proceeds from lack of thought, being heedless, lack of diligence. Being *inadvertent* means negligent, careless, showing lack of attention, inconsiderate, giving your attention to other things.

Lev 4:13 speaks of the inadvertent sin of a community (verses 22,27). Gal 6:1 — *Inadvertently*. If you are spiritual go and help them see it (they don't mean to do it, but they do it

all the time, Gal 6:1). “Whoever is overtaken” (caught) — they fall into it all the time; it is unconscious, inadvertent.

Women in Leadership

Who is able to lead, passing your staff on to others? Women are in leadership in certain ways, though of course those women are always covered by man. 1 Tim 3:11 — That kind of woman needs to have dignity, be faithful (full of faith) in all things, be wholly and entirely reliable, and be revered (#4586), which means that is exhibiting a behavior that is dignified, honorable, decent, worthy of respect. They should see things circumspectly. There should not be things that she does that keep her from having respect, like not seeing things in the right way. 1 Cor 12:24 — Equal care in the Body, like for example in the food distribution. Women set a good example. They command respect. That is the type of woman who needs to be in a role of authority over other people in certain aspects.

Contentious People

Contentious people go to the lake of fire. You cannot have mercy on them. They need to be driven out of the community. They cause disunity (Titus 3:10-11). The Laodiceans would certainly never think that they were lukewarm, that they lost their first love. A letter had to be written to them. It talks about a synagogue of Satan. They didn't know they were one.

Decisions Made in Council

No one in his right mind would ever think to change what's been decided in council. If we don't carry out what we say in council, it is from the council of the evil one. We have to take action and do what we say in the council.

Distribute the Gifts

The elders are going to hell if they don't distribute the gifts where they need to be.
