

Dear Abba,

While Jacob and I were in Fort Meyers Yoneq read a letter after the gathering one evening that Jesse Benjamin had sent him. Many things were spoken from the letter and much of this we have been hearing in teachings the past few weeks. Yoneq told me to write you about our gathering that evening. Here are a few of the things we heard.

As revelation and prophecy increase we will stop living by “soul power”, instead we will live by a transcendent life with the power of the Holy Spirit filling our souls. Yoneq said he doesn’t know if we even know what it means to have his spirit in our souls, the soul being made up of will, emotions, and intellect. 1st Cor. 6:17 says “he who joins himself with Messiah is one spirit with him”. This equals union but communion equals his holy spirit filling our will, intellect, and emotions. Apart from communion one can’t be saved (transformed) or be able to communicate the gospel to another’s spirit penetrating their heart and not just their emotions. You can only imagine when our whole nation is able to live like this and the effect it will have.

We also heard about the priests of the old covenant , how they cared so much about the brand new culture , and the life our god was desiring to establish in the new promise land they were entering. The priests were the first into the water of the Jordan. They were willing to sacrifice their lives if that is what it took so that the nation could cross over on them were the waters not to part. We heard that the extent of their devotion and trust was to where they walked right into the raging, flooding river not knowing if they were going to be swept away or pile up making a human causeway for the rest of Israel to cross over. They understood their lives may have had to be ransomed for the sake of the nation. They knew our Father said go yet the water rushed in front of them. They were to take on our Father’s heart about everything in order not to taint this new culture. This especially spoke to me. Deut. 13:15 we also heard about. It says that the dreamer arises in our midst so that our Father can test us to see if we love him with all of our hearts and soul. This dreamer is often inside of us trying to woo us to turn aside toward the leeks and garlies of Egypt or simply wishing we were in another circumstance other than what our Father has us in, trying to turn us from true love and pure devotion for serving our God. If this dreamer is allowed to live we will taint our culture bringing in other loves by appeasing our own pallet. We will have impact on the delicate balance of the recipe of the community/ the loaf, or else be destroyed our self in order to save the whole. It takes believing that we affect the whole, especially how our Father doesn’t accept

our Minchah unless we are all in unity judging ourselves properly. Each of us makes up part of the lamb that must be without defect. Each of these things speaks to me every time I read over it. I want to learn these things in my heart. I added a little more to this letter and sent it by mail, but I wanted to hurry and get this to you. I am very sorry it has taken me so long.
