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The Murder of Messiah

The loss of love is tantamount to the loss of the Spirit, and tantamount to the murder of Messiah is to eat and drink unworthily. Our life lived in the Edah is as Col 1:1-13, a corresponding sacrifice. 1 Cor 11:27-29 — Paul uses the words *unworthy manner*. We must be walking, living as Col 1:10, or we must be confessing our sin and be completely forgiven — or what we are doing by coming in here is unworthy of Him and is tantamount to murdering Messiah.

1 Cor 11:28 — So a man must judge himself rightly. Verse 31 — We must carry out a thorough investigation upon ourselves before walking in here tonight. The whole of the first church is cut off — dead — in death — Rev 3:4. To eat and drink unworthily is to be guilty of the Blood and Body of our Master. We must inspect ourselves just as the priest inspected the sacrifice offered for the sins of the nation — or the nation is cut off before God.

Ps 51:14 — Bloodguiltiness denotes murder — but to be guilty of the Body is greater guilt. It is the guilt of the whole world (1 Cor 11:32). 1 Cor 10:17 — The Master's table — the supper is a feast, 1 Cor 5:8, of a sacrificial nature. It is a sacrifice. Rev 3:4 — Worthy — only the few had not stained or defiles their outer garments. They are worthy to walk with Him in white. Most were guilty of murdering Messiah. Their community was already dead because of them, Rev 3:1, even Rev 3:16-18 (20-21). The erring ones in the first church were Messiah's murderers.

Ex 24:5-8 — Behold, the blood of the covenant. Yahshua said the same thing 2,000 years later, "This is the New Covenant in my blood. As the former covenant was confirmed by sacrificing oxen, so do I confirm this New Covenant by the sacrifice of myself."

To partake worthily is Col 1:10 or Pr 28:13 (1 John 1:9 — 2:2; and 1 John 1:6 and 2:4). Our walk is Col 1:10. 1 John 1:6,7 in the light — is the test of our fellowship with Him and results in peace among the brotherhood.
