No Complaint in Israel

If we complain we don't even know why we are here. In the new covenant it says, "Whoever complains and murmurs is cut off from the new covenant." When we confessed Yahshua as our Sovereign we made a vow to never complain and murmur.

That's what Israel did. The moment they had crossed the Red Sea they complained. That shows the rabble. The rabble had come out of Egypt with them. The whole nation was cut off.

It's an amazing thing. We don't even know why we are here. It's recorded in the Word that our Father allowed these things to happen to show them what was in their heart.

Eli had sons, amazing sons, but they were all worthless. They didn't have any regard for YHWH. They did the work, but when it came to the things of YHWH, they had no regard. Can you imagine just being here in the community, working, but not having regard for the things of YHWH? They did all kinds of evil things right there in the sacrifice. They didn't prepare themselves for the sacrifice when they gathered every morning. They didn't read a "Simply the Truth" and bring something to the minchah. That's a priest. If we don't do that we have no regard for YHWH.

The Holy Spirit teaches us all things, and what makes us a rebellious people is if we don't do it. We have no complaint in our heart, but only constructive criticism, but not according to our personal liking. We don't just want to put better food on the table according to our own liking, but for the good of all so we would live a long life. In the future we will eat good food, good for our spirit, but not so much appealing for our flesh. The last three years before we flee to the wilderness we probably will eat only dried food, stored up food, because we can't buy or sell. They ultimately will cut off our electricity and put an economic embargo on us. We won't be able to buy or sell. In the wilderness we will be nourished by our Father.

When we eat dried food it will purge the Body from complainers. We will only have a little bit to eat and drink. It's going to cause complaint to rise up in people (Mt 24:9-12) and they will leave right before we go to the wilderness. That's wonderful — our Father will finally have a pure people. But if we even have complaint in our heart in the wilderness we won't be taken — we weren't faithful to endure until the end. We made a vow to never let complaint come out of our mouth. This will bring encouragement to the Body.

There is always complaint. Eli's sons were worthless. That's the rabble who complain. I don't want to be worthless. I don't want our children to be worthless. 1 Cor 10 — The last generation won't complain. Those who see our Master's return won't complain. That's why it was recorded for the last generation. Their bodies fell in the wilderness. We are the ones living for them. We are the hope of Israel. We don't need to murmur and complain. We are here to overcome that. Let's give our sacrifice. Let's give thanks.

Children, I want you to find out where Eli's sons are today — where they will be in eternity. You have to judge them some day. It says that the saints will judge the world.

There is one book in Revelation. Find out about that book. Everything is recorded in that book of what people did and why they did it, if they did it from a selfish motive, if they did it for their own glory.

What does it say about worthless people? Where will they go? What does it mean to show regard? Find out.

Has your abba read to you sometimes the teaching about Eli's sons? We have a wonderful teaching about it. 1 Sam 1-4.
