Practicing the Truth

1 John 1:6. We can put into practice what we hear. It's not just hearing things, filling your head but actually being able to put into practice what we hear. People get up in the morning and start laying their lives down, practicing the truth. They don't have to be told to lay down their lives. We want to practice what we hear. Be zealous. Our children grow up practicing the truth, hearing the truth and singing about Yahshua. The test is when the cord is unplugged, when we are dismissed from the sacrifice we find out whether we put into practice what we hear. This is the difference between us and Christianity.

The danger for our children, especially when they grow up, is not so much fighting the world in their minds but not walking in His strength, drifting away and taking for granted what they have. 1 John 1:6. We must distinguish between having fellowship with Him and walking in darkness. If we are in darkness we have to seek Him. Being indifferent means nothing is going on inside of us. We need to seek Him. He may hide from you to see what you will do. We are His children. Whether you feel good or not, you praise Him. Without a will like that you can't be a son. We are purified, made like Him in everything. Eph 2:10. If we don't walk in those works, ENERGETICALLY, then we walk around in darkness, indifferent, so we are drifting away.
