

Shout from the Courts

When we speak, it is by faith. It is because our Father has spoken to us; we pass it on; it is food for us and we live by it. Virtue is to speak by what you have heard. Therefore, when we meet in the courts, you are to speak what the Holy Spirit has spoken to you about. It is yours and your children's. The commandment is this: whatever is whispered in your ear, shout it from the rooftops. And then He will reveal Himself to us more and more. It is a matter of life and death. And what we speak has to be what we have heard. When someone speaks the faith they received by hearing, then we hear it and we receive faith. And that is how we live — by faith, by what we hear. It is all by faith, by what we hear, by what we received that comes to us by what we hear.

Some people say they will gut it out by faith, but that is a ridiculous idea. That is all that Christians can say. But faith is hearing our Father speak to you intimately in your heart, giving you the strength and confidence to do it. And that is how we speak — by faith. Some special case new disciples come in with all sorts of “enlightenment” which they received in the world and they speak, but they could have said the same thing three months ago when they were in the world — it is not from faith. We have to watch them. You can tell by what they say. If they go beyond the word, they do not have God.

So remember, whatever is whispered in your ear, shout it from the rooftop, shout it in the courts when we come, because we need to hear what the Holy Spirit has revealed to you. He did not reveal it to us, he revealed it to you so that you could share it and then we could hear it also. Revelation is not just for you, it is for everyone. Everyone can share what he has heard from Him. If you do not share what you have heard from Him, then your shepherds will come to you and say, “What's going on with

you? Why is our Father not revealing anything to you?" So we need to shout what we have heard when we enter the courts.
