A Sin unto Death 2

There is a sin unto death, and there is no hope in this life to repent. 1 Jn 5:16; 3:6. There's no way to live in sin if you maintain fellowship. This doesn't mean that you won't sin, but you won't live in sin.

Matt 18:8 — If you reach out your hand to touch someone sexually it'd be that your hand was cut off. Matt 5:27. If we maintain fellowship with Him, we will not sin. If we walk in the light as He is in the light, we have fellowship and the blood of Messiah will cleanse us from all sin. It is a continual cleansing.

Heb 10:26 — knowingly and willingly. Only abiding can we walk victoriously.

Matt 12:37 — Even our Master tried to speak to Judas.

If your right eye is a snare to you take it out and throw it away. Matt 18:7-9. It would be better for a millstone to be around your neck and to be thrown into the sea than to cause one of his little ones to stumble (Matt 18:6).

Ps 97:8 — 1,000 fall at your side, but it will not approach you, if you make the Most High your dwelling place. If you lift up your soul to an idol and don't pray that you can be delivered from evil and temptation, you will be judged and tempted and fall.

1 Jn 5:16; Matt 5:27-28 — Even to look at another woman with lust is sin. The only thing left to do is to go on and follow our Master, Yahshua. He is worthy.

The only reason we would be turned over to the torturers is if we're claiming to see and we don't see — claiming to see and not seeing and claiming to walk in the light.

1 Jn 1:6; 2:4 — Not committing adultery is one of His commandments.

Jn 8:57 — Our Father was faithful to speak to us last night about the sin unto death.

Heb 6:4 — Held Messiah up for public shame. Prov. 28:13 There was no confessing or forsaking. There is no mercy or forgiveness from us or our Father in this age and in the age to come. Our Father always provides a way out. We're never taken captive helplessly. The enemy has no power over us. There is no pain like the pain of adultery. The world can't even know — they're forgiven. They've forgotten what it was like.
