

## Using our Will

We can't sin or do good unless a spirit prompts our will. Our will and desire must cooperate, give itself to the prompters — Jms 1:14. Even the natural law...there are angels — fallen and unfallen (holy)... holy or evil. A man is inclined morally and politically even, to the right or the left, Eccl 10:2.

The judgment will be based on whether each man did good or evil — Eccl 12:14; Rev 20:12,13. With our will we say "No" to evil... or to good. With our will we say "Yes" to evil...or to good. With our will we say "Yes" or "No" to good or evil — Jms 4:17.

At the judgment we will be rewarded for our choices...even the nations, as Mt 25:14-46. Every time the gospel is heard, one must make a choice according to their will — Jn 7:17 — to receive or refuse a Freepaper.

Those who are called, and those who are chosen must make a decision according to their will... and also the faithful must continually choose to do God's will, to obey Him, 1 Tim 2:4, to be saved, and then to come to the knowledge of the truth. The will cooperates with the gospel, and then the Word of God for our instruction in righteousness.

God works through man's will... so man must stand in the judgment and answer for what he did, whether good or evil, as Gen 2:17-3:3 — the tree of the knowledge of good and evil. So man knows alright, but he went on and did the things he knew were wrong — Rom 1:18-2:16 (Living Bible).

God works the good...Satan works the evil. Seth and Noah worked the good God wanted them to do, because they wanted to please God... or they had a will to please Him, and to choose the good over the evil.
